GSP

P (1).

1. Mapes' Agdenusher Mulberry. BP. Lovely masculine head and expression. Well-proportioned and plenty of work in it at this stage. Good shaped eye and correctly set ear. Well boned and correct feet. Well bodied for his age. A good depth of brisket, correct topline and tail set. Well let down behind and move well enough with his stand in handler.

Yearling (2,1)

1. Spencer & Husband's Waldburg Vonzach. Masculine boy with good bone and feet. Powerful neck into well bodied structure for his age. Strong loin and correct topline and correctly set tail. Well conditioned. Like a little less of him all through.

O (4,1)

1. Blay's Sh Ch Barleyarch Skye At Longbarrow ShCM. BOB & BIS. A well made bitch with nothing exaggerated, refined and feminine throughout. Lovely soft expression and kind eye. Lots of work in her head creating that typical GSP type. Good straight front with bone in proportion to her frame. Good feet. Shoulders well laid back and close to the body. Good depth of brisket in a strong loin. Good rear angles and showed on the move. True movement both ways, keeping her balance in profile.
2. Dymond's Sh Ch Quintana Diamond Dust At Friarsbelle. RBOB. Well made front with good bone and feet. A little over developed through his shoulder. Well ribbed back and good depth of brisket. Masculine boy throughout. Lost out on movement to 1<sup>st</sup>.
3. Spencer & Husband's Waldburg Vonzach.

Irish Setter

P (1)

1. Hall's Riverbrue Ophelia Love Glennara. BP. A pretty headed with a lovely soft and typical expression. Well balanced head. Bone in proportion with a well made frame. Good feet and well arched. Good depth of brisket and correct spring of rib into strong loin and on into a well made rear construction. Not the best of rings to see her in full stride.

Yearling (4)

1. Rorke's Zakhani Diamond Queen. It's amazing the difference a month can make in terms of maturity and a different venue. Today I preferred her overall balance and proportions. In good condition and well presented. Lovely rich deep chestnut colour. Moved well when she settled with a good tail set and carriage. Pleasing head with prominent occiput.
2. Rorke's Zakhani's Diamond Jack. Good bone and feet. Good bone and feet, well ribbed and depth of brisket. Well balanced proportions to the head, plenty of length and good prominent occipital. Good deep chestnut colour.
3. Harris' Zakhani Rough Diamond By Konakakela

PG (3)

1. Pine's Seowns Snoops. RBOB. Preferred overall make and shape, cleaner in outline. Masculine boy well bodied with good bone and feet. Good rich chestnut. Moved out well behind.
2. Fox & Fiders' Kerryfair Heart To Heart. Not so clean flowing though the neck and shoulder of 1<sup>st</sup>. Good bone and a well made rear with correct angulation. Happy on the move with good driving movement.
3. Bromwich's Pengelirish Lord Nicodemus

O (6,4)

1. Rorke's Zakhan's The Red Le Baron. BOB. Pulls into a balance make and shape. Masculine boy full of type. Well matured throughout. Well made rear with correct angulation to the stifle. Correct sloping topline and tail set.
2. Bromwich's Pengelirish Lord Nicodemus. In super coat and condition with a silky texture. Well bodied with good bone and a good depth of brisket. Different type compared to 1<sup>st</sup>. lighter throughout.

English Springer Sp.

P (3,1)

1. Cox's Tiroen To Have And To Hold. BP. A lovely classic, feminine ESS head and expression. Kind eye, correctly set ear. Well bodied for her young age. Well ribbed back with correct spring. Good depth of brisket and nice tight elbows. Happy on the move and held herself with confidence. Going look at me!
2. Walker's Dexealla It's Only Me. A different type with not quite the head of 1<sup>st</sup>. Well made rear with good bend of stifle. Mature boy, with good bone and tight feet. Clean neck. Needed to lift his head on the move.

Yearling (4,1)

1. Weyman's Spuffing Prosecco. Preferred the size and balance. Lovely feminine head and expression. Bone in proportion, well ribbed back with correct spring. Strong loin and a good depth of brisket to the elbow. Move true both ways.
2. Wilson's Kingsheath Kushida At Cassapple. Tended to lose her topline in profile movement. Good bone and tight feet. Well bodied with a good spring of rib and well coupled. Like a little more rear angulation.
3. Scotting's Ashring's Love Touch For Recondy.

PG (1).

1. Williams' Cobhay Fancy Phlox. A well balanced bitch. Well bodied with good depth of chest, well ribbed and strong loin into a well made rear with a well set tail. Good topline and move well out. Like a little less developed across the shoulder.

O (7,1)

1. Hydon's Clentonian Pandemonium JW. BOB. A close class however I preferred the front construction, clean through the neck and shoulder into a good straight front with good bone and tight feet. Good rear angles and well let down hock. Kept her topline on the move.
2. Taubman's Meltarose Madeleine At Meonstoke. RBOB. Loved her head and expression, moved well keeping her topline. Well boned but would like tighter feet. Well let down behind and moved well both ways.
3. Cox's Petranella Fleur De Lily Avec Tiroen

Welsh Springer Sp.

P (2)

1. Naunton's Trenzalore's Bill Potts. A typical Welshie head and expression with a kind eye. Good bone and cat like feet. Well ribbed back and good loin, and depth of brisket. Moved well both ways. A well proportioned puppy.
2. Cartman's Trenzalore's Mandalorian. Not quite as typical head type compared to 1<sup>st</sup>. Well boned and good feet. A lovely rich red coat in good condition and well presented. Well made rear and showed when moving away from you with good footfall.

#### Yearling (2)

1. Stone's Kidenan Mark Time For Merrem JW. BOB. Maturity was the difference today between these two. Pulls himself into a lovely shape. Level topline with correct tailset, with a tail that never stopped wagging. Good coat texture with rich red colour. A masculine head without coarseness. A well marked boy.
2. Naunton's Trenzalore's Princess Lea. Lighter all through and just needs to drop into herself which should come with age. Good rear construction with good bend of stifle. Well ribbed back and strong loin. Good bone and cat like feet. Feminine head and expression. Moved away with some drive.

#### PG (2)

1. White's Mymmsbrook Malbec With Fiergen. Well proportioned body to height ratio. Well bodied with a good spring of rib and depth of brisket. Strong loin into a well made muscular rear end with good bend of stifle. Good rich colour and in good condition. Move well, would like a better return of upper arm.
2. Jackson's Catjack Everpreciousone. Typical welshie head and expression. Good rich red colour and a very happy person on the move. Carrying a little too much weight all through.

#### O (4,1)

1. Woodhams' Glynell Jiffy. A challenging class. The handler made a better job of getting the best out of this exhibit. Carrying a little too much weight. A well made rear with a good bend of stifle. Well boned and good feet. Pleasing head and expression. Movement was good both ways.
2. Gough's Julita Rukester. I preferred his type; however, the handler didn't get the best out of his exhibit. Good coat and condition, deep rich red colour. Well made rear with good bone and cat like feet. Well bodied with a good spring of rib.

#### Easter Puppy Stakes (26,16)

1. Mathews & Adams' Carofel Wings Of Hope (Pointer). O&W. Masculine head and expression with a well defined stop. Good pigmentation. Straight front. Good oval bone with well arched and padded feet. Well ribbed with depth of brisket to the elbow. Correct topline with short coupling. Well made rear and this showed on the move, driving off with purpose.
2. Webber & Sladden's Valcor Killer Queen (Bracco). Lovely outline, make and shape. Pleasing head and ear. Well made clean front construction. Super open gait in profile, covering the ground with ease. Played the handler up just at the wrong times.
3. Burchell's Oryxes Kissing the Waves On Tivalake (Imp Can)

1. Stone's Kidenan Mark Time For Merrem JW (WSS).

Easter Open Stakes (26,14)

1. Wilson's Hameldowntor Music Of The Night (Imp) (Flat Coat). Full of life and happy. Well balanced in profile. Good depth of brisket and correct ribbing. In super coat and condition. Moved well when settled, keeping a correct topline in profile, good foot fall. This coming from a well made rear, giving the driving power.
2. Bowen-Brooks' Tenshilling Here I Go Again (Pointer). B&W. Really liked this exhibit but played up at the wrong time. Presenting a well balanced make and shape when stood. Well made forehead, with a clean neck and shoulder. Pleasing head and expression. Moved true both ways with a good topline and typical bee sting tail.
3. Watts' Sh Ch Oakmarsh Chesnut (Chesapeake)

BIS

1. Blay's Sh Ch Barleyarch Skye At Longbarrow ShCM. Really came into her own in the big ring. Nothing exaggerated and a good honest bitch well worthy of her title.
2. Bradley's Sh Ch Stanegate Stage Debut (AI) (Irish Water Sp.). Another bitch well worthy of her title. Not quite as well presented as the last time I judged her. But her quality shines through and a good example of this breed.
3. Beecham's Crumledor Albus Dumbledor At Rydonmist (Sussex Sp). A very honest example of this breed. A lot of substance to him, a super head and expression and that typical Sussex roll on the move. Being true both ways and kept his topline.
4. Loake's Goldbirch Hearts Desire JW (Eng. Set.) A young bitch with that typical English style. Tail didn't stop. Well made with good bone and feet. Well ribbed and good loin, keeping a level topline on the move, just needs time and maturity to complete her.

BPIS

1. Tagg's Oiyou Double Espresso (Flat Coat). A well made youngster that really was enjoying her day. Moved out well both ways and kept a balanced picture in profile around the ring. Well made with a typical flat coat head and expression. Well ribbed back with strong loin, going into a well made rear. Super conditioning to the coat with a nice shiny gleam to it.
2. Welch, Drake & Hazeltine's Clamerkin Jubilee Surprise At Hookwood (Pointer). A well made bitch, well balanced head with defined stop, good eye and ear set. Clean neck and shoulder into a straight front, with good oval bone and correct feet. Well ribbed into a short coupling. Moved out well and well handled. Just missed out on maturity.
3. Cox's Tiroen To Have And To Hold. (ESS)
4. Bailiff's Oroshaza Be Be At Cazadorado (Vizsla). The handler certainly got the best out of her. Happy youngster still needing to mature but given time. Pretty head and expression into a good neck and lay of shoulder. Well made rear construction. Moved well in front but just needs to tighten up in front.
